Development Council (REDCs)



Each community develops a **Strategic Investment Plan** to identify transformative projects to be funded in part through NYF

Provide diverse employment opportunities for a variety of skill sets and salary levels





Overall NY Forward Process

- ✓ Village submitted an application to REDC and was awarded NY Forward funding
- Now: Community planning process solicits and develops potential NY Forward projects (now through December)
 - Sponsors submit Open Call for Projects form
 - Consultant team reviews project proposals and works with sponsors
 - LPC votes to recommend list of projects for funding consideration (Strategic Investment Plan/SIP)
 - o Note: recommended projects should total \$6-8M in requested NYF funding
- Later: State team reviews SIP and awards projects from LPC's recommended list totaling **\$4.5M** in NYF funding
 - Funded projects begin after contracting period
 - Note: NY Forward award is a reimbursable grant to project sponsors
 (sponsor pays initially and gets reimbursed later, typically when project completed)

Key components of a Strategic Investment Plan

A clear vision for the downtown

Goals and strategies to accomplish the vision

Recommended catalytic projects to implement the plan

Project proposals needed

LPC will issue **open call for projects** that <u>all</u> project sponsors must respond to

- Village's application to the State identified <u>potential</u> project ideas – likely to change
- Actively working to identify additional projects
- Projects should be within the NYF boundary

SPREAD THE WORD!

Open call for projects

- NYF focused on implementable projects, not just ideas
- Online form, office hours, webinar
- Requires detailed information about project sponsor, proposed project, funding, costs, etc.


NYF PROJECT PROPOSALS

Eligibility Requirements

Projects must also meet the following eligibility requirements to be considered:

- Identified project sponsor with capacity and legal authority to undertake project
- ✓ Project sponsor has site control
- Large enough to be truly transformative to downtown
- Must be able to break ground within two years of receiving NYF award
- Financing commitments largely secured or demonstrated to be able to be secured
- Includes decarbonization techniques (if new construction, substantial renovation, or building addition)

NYF funds must be designated toward capital initiatives!


NYF BOUNDARIES

Village of Chittenango's Preliminary NYF Boundary

Proposed boundary in application

Along Genesee Street From Old Erie Canal south to W Genesee Street

Potential projects should be within boundary – or nearby and make a case for inclusion



Draft vision statement

"The Village of Chittenango envisions a vibrant and welcoming community that celebrates our unique heritage, embraces sustainability, and fosters innovation. Our downtown will be a dynamic hub where history meets the future, drawing residents and visitors alike to enjoy our rich cultural offerings, active public spaces, and thriving local businesses. Through the Creekwalk Trail system, our downtown area is directly linked to the Empire State Trail, and we will continue to strengthen the connection to attract visitors from all over the world to our downtown. We commit to nurturing a connected, inclusive, and resilient village, where every voice shapes our journey, and every project strengthens our collective identity."

Project ideas from the Village's application*

Private Sector: Potential \$13.8M Total Investment

• **Building Renovations, Small Business Support**: support building renovations, new construction, and various improvements of commercial, retail, institutional, recreational and historic buildings. Eleven potential projects identified in application.

Public Sector: Potential \$1.2M Total Investment

- Dr. West Park Enhancements: Install a dance floor and new bathroom facilities to bolster current events
- Creekwalk Amenities: Gateway, landscaping, and other improvements to beloved community creekside trail
- Genesee Street Streetscape: Improving Genesee Street streetscape in line with Vision 2020
- Sullivan Free Library Improvements: Roof replacement and exterior column replacement at existing library
- Chittenango Fire Company Renovations: Façade and roof improvements
- Gateway Signage & Public Art: Concentrated marketing and branding campaign inclusive of public art
- Small Project Fund: Establish a façade improvement grant program



Vision example from NYF Round 1:

Made famous by Washington Irving's short story, the Village of Sleepy Hollow will become a year-round destination for residents and visitors alike by building upon its strengths—a charming and walkable mixed-use district located near to public transit, thriving immigrant-owned small businesses, and the beautiful Hudson River waterfront. In doing so, the Village will cultivate a downtown that expands opportunities for all.
